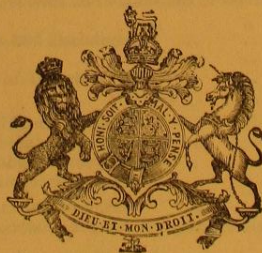

THE REPORT of the Director of Recruiting and Organization appears again as a portion of this Report, but has not been issued separately this year.


The following slight modifications have been made in the Statistical Section of the Report this year :—
