Colonel Bird served in the South African war in 1899-1900 with the 2nd Battalion Royal Dublin Fusiliers, and commanded the Battalion in the engagement at Talana and the subsequent retirement to Ladysmith; was present in the engagement at Lombard's Kop and at the relief of Ladysmith—severely injured by a fall from his horse while on duty at Estcourt (mentioned in despatches); commanded the Battalion from 27th March to 6th April; took part in the operations in Orange River Colony under Major General Hart, under Sir Archibald Hunter including the capture of Fourteen Streams and Christians, in the pursuit of De Wet under Lord Kitchener, and in Potchefstroom under Major General Hart; commanded Infantry in General Hamilton's Brigade in December, 1900, and also in General Knox's Brigade during the operations in the Eastern Transvaal under General French from January to April, 1902 (three times mentioned in despatches, DSO).
