Dear Mr. Sykes: This is a new address. I send you back Irish Blather which I have read. Many thanks. If possible I should like to see other numbers, old or new. I suuppose\* the Fortnightly has not yet arrived. Weather good here. Two dull days since we came. For the rest, sun. My wife got Mrs. Syke's\* kind letter and will write – very soon. Am getting on with my book.

Dear Mr Sykes: Thanks for card. I wrote to Mr G. Telephone to see if all is right. If not try the Metropole (Fraumunsterstrasse\*). Can you make three copies? Scribbling in great haste. Please make these two changes also:

- 1) for "The Dicers and thimbleriggers etc..." (v. description of racecourse) read "Dicers and himbleriggers....", i.e. without "The".
- 2) after "His seacold eyes looked over the empty bay: ..." insert after colon ": hist it seems "history is to blame:" & then continue as before "on me and on my words".

There was another correction to make but I cannot remember it.

I am rather troublesome, I fear. I wrote the MS in a very legible hand, I think. I know I tried to. Can you cap the limerick?
